### City cosmos – beyond the city limits

Wiener Neustadt presents itself against the backdrop of global history in the former 13th-century abbey church of St. Peter an der Sperr. The focus here is on the reigns of Habsburg Emperors Frederick III and Maximilian I, and Wiener Neustadt as their famed seat of power. The city’s historical development – from onetime imperial residence to industrial city and the modern-day centre of innovation it is today – is told through the biographies of key figures.
